EPIPHANY

Epiphany is one of the oldest and most important Catholic celebrations, along with Christmas and Easter. It marks the official end of Christmas. Epiphany is celebrated on January 6th, which is the 12th day of Christmas. It is also known as Three Kings' Day. The word "epiphany" means "manifestation" or "to show". In the Bible, it refers to Jesus being revealed as God's Son. The story of the Magi's star shows that Jesus' destiny was not determined by the star, but by his birthplace. The Magi followed the star to Bethlehem, where Jesus was born.



The Baptism of the Lord Sunday, January 12th

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord celebrates the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. We know that — since Jesus was born without sin — he did not really need to be baptized. And yet, Jesus welcomes his own baptism as an example for the rest of us and as a sign of his true identity. He is God's son, the living presence of God on earth. Take some time this month to talk to your kids about their own baptism (even if you've told the story before!). Talk about who was there, how their godparents were chosen and the celebration after the sacrament.

Sacramental Catch Up Class

Is your child interested in receiving Reconciliation and Communion, but older than the norm? PREP offers an annual Sacramental Catch Up class for those students in levels 3-7 who may have missed their First Reconciliation and Communion during 2nd grade and would like to receive these sacraments.
